## **UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES**

### **Mission**

The mission of the Florida A&M University Libraries is to provide a user centered information environment that supports inspirational teaching, exemplary research, meaningful service, and life long learning to the local and global university community.

## <u>Libraries</u>

#### Main Library Coleman Memorial Library

Samuel H. Coleman Memorial Library, the University's main library, is named for Samuel Harrison Coleman, who served the University as general alumni president for 14 years. The Library was built in 1948, renovated in 1972, expanded in 1990 and again in 2004. The 88,964 square foot facility includes group study rooms, a student study lounge and cafe, graduate/faculty study carrels, a student digitization suite, a student presentation practice room and a state of the art information literacy classroom. Along with the additional 20,000 square feet available in the branch libraries the University Libraries provide a seating capacity of 920. The branch libraries, which are located in selected schools and colleges, offer resources and services in their respective disciplines.

#### Architecture Library\*

School of Architecture Walter L. Smith Building

The collection of the School of Architecture Library, located in room 104-B of the Walter L. Smith School of Architecture Building, consists of monographs and periodicals pertaining to architecture construction technology, design and other related fields.

#### School of Journalism and Graphic Communication\*

The School of Journalism and Graphic Communication Resources Center, holds a core collection of books, periodicals, and audiovisual resources, including microtext, that support the research and information needs of students and faculty in the areas of print (newspaper, magazine) and broadcast (radio, television) journalism, public relations, photography, graphic design, printing production technology, and printing management and supervision.



#### Science Research Center Library\*

Frederick S. Humphries Science Research Center

The Science Research Center Library, located in 401-501 of the Frederick S. Humphries Science Research Center, serves the research and information needs of students, faculty and staff in the fields of Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Sciences, Nursing & Allied Health Science, Environmental Science, Physics, Computer Science and other related disciplines.

#### FAMU/FSU Engineering Library\*

College of Engineering

The FAMU/FSU Engineering Library is located in Room 225 in the Herbert F. Morgan, building (Innovation Park). The collection supports the fields of Chemical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. The Engineering Library provides resources and services to support the needs of the faculty, staff and students of the FAMU/FSU College of Engineering.

#### FAMU Development Research School Library

The Developmental Research School Library is located in the Developmental Research School (DRS), which functions under the College of Education. The library provides collections to support kindergarten through twelfth grade curricula.

#### Law Library, Law School

The Law Library, which functions under the College of Law, provides faculty and students access to primary sources of American law: court reporters, federal statutes, state codes and statutes, periodicals, microforms, and online electronic databases.
